1959 р.н., закінчив у 1981 р. Київський університет за спеціальністю “міжнародні відносини”. Доктор історичних наук, проф. кафедри політології. У 1985-1991 рр. працював в Інституті історії НАН України. У 1991-1992 рр. декан-організатор факультету суспільних наук Національного університету “Києво-Могилянська Академія” (НаУКМА), у 1993-94 рр. перший зав. кафедрою політології НаУКМА. У 2005-2006 рр. – регіональний віце-президент Фонду «Євразія» по Україні, Білорусі та Молдові. У 2002 р. заснував Школу політичної аналітики при НаУКМА, наразі – її директор.

Автор книг “Убити дракона: З історії Руху та нових партій України” (1993); “Трансатлантические дебаты: Поворот Западной Европы к разрядке и позиция США” (1990). Редактор збірки “Україна багатопартійна” (1991), співредактор книг “Становлення владних структур в Україні” (1997), “Українські ліві: між ленінізмом і соціал-демократією” (2000), “Политические и экономические преобразования в России и Украине” (Москва, 2003). Протягом чотирьох років поспіль редагував доповідь про Україну у щорічнику *Nations in Transit*, що видається *Freedom House* і висвітлює проблеми громадянського суспільства, мас-медіа, взаємодії трьох гілок влади у 27 пост-комуністичних країнах.

З 1989 р. - досвід консультування виборчих кампаній, ЗМІ, міжнародних компаній і організацій (у тому числі Світового банку).

Неодноразово виступав з лекціями за кордоном (Гарвард, Колумбія, Берклі, Стенфорд, Фонд Карнегі за міжнародну безпеку, РЕНД, Інститут Брукінгса, Школа слов'янських та східноєвропейських досліджень /Лондон/ та ін). Аналітичні доповіді О.Гараня видавалися у Школі державного управління ім. Кеннеді (Гарвард), Центрі стратегічних та міжнародних досліджень (Вашингтон), Федеральному інституті східноєвропейських досліджень (Кьольн) тощо. Друкувався в газетах *Gazeta Wyborcza*, *The Baltimore Sun*, *The Ukrainian Weekly*, *The Kyiv Post* та багатьох інших, консультації для журналу *The Economist*. У 1996-97 рр. брав участь у створенні газети “День”.

Входив до складу наглядових рад Інституту ім. Кеннана (Вашингтон) та журналу *Pro et Contra* (Москва), Консультативної ради неурядових організацій при Міністерстві закордонних справ України, американо-російської “Програми нових підходів до російської безпеки” (PONARS) та дорадчої ради журналу *Demokratizatsiya.
